We encourage the children to read **5** times a week and the books are changed on a Monday and Thursday. Don't forget to record their reading in their diary every time. This does not have to be just the books we send home, it can be anything they enjoy reading such as comics, food labels at the supermarket, street signs or bedtime stories.

Being in Potter class:

In Potter Class the children enjoy learning through play and carrying out challenges to extend their learning further. we learn inside and outside whatever the weather so please ensure that your child has appropriate clothing that is named. As the weather warms up please provide a hat and ensure sun cream is applied.

As the children have become so engrossed in the topic this half term we have organised a mini car show on Tuesday 17th of May where we have a variety of vehicles that will be parked on the bottom playground for them to look around and compare.

Other information:

We politely ask that the children do not bring in toys from home as this is causing distractions with their learning within the classroom.
